Course descriptions

FALL SEMESTER

COM 225 Public Speaking

ECTS Credits: 6 | Contact Hours per Week: 3-0-0

Students develop effective communication and presentation skills through speech organization, persuasive communication, presentation design, and hands-on presentation practice.

CIS 105 Computer Applications and IT

ECTS Credits: 6 | Contact Hours per Week: 3-0-0

Students develop practical skills in computer applications and digital technologies for creating, managing, and presenting information using contemporary computing tools.

MAT 117 College Algebra

ECTS Credits: 6 | Contact Hours per Week: 3-0-0

Students develop algebraic techniques and mathematical reasoning through linear, quadratic, polynomial, exponential, and logarithmic functions, equations, and mathematical modeling

PRM 120 Leisure and Quality of Life

ECTS Credits: 6 | Contact Hours per Week: 3-0-0

Students explore the social, cultural, psychological, and economic significance of leisure, recreation, wellness, community engagement, and sustainable leisure practices

MAT 265 Calculus I

ECTS Credits: 6 | Contact Hours per Week: 3-0-0

Students develop differential calculus skills through limits, derivatives, optimization, curve sketching, and introductory integration techniques for engineering and scientific applications.

PSY 101 Introduction to Psychology

ECTS Credits: 6 | Contact Hours per Week: 3-0-0

Students explore human behavior and mental processes, examining biological, cognitive, developmental, social, and emotional aspects of psychology.

SPRING SEMESTER

MAT 265 Calculus I

ECTS Credits: 6 | Contact Hours per Week: 3-0-0

Also offered in the Fall semester — see description opposite.

AIL 101 AI Literacy

ECTS Credits: 6 | Contact Hours per Week: 3-0-0

Students develop practical AI skills to enhance learning, problem-solving, communication, and productivity while critically evaluating AI's opportunities, limitations, and societal impact

PHI 105 Introduction to Ethics

ECTS Credits: 6 | Contact Hours per Week: 3-0-0

Students explore ethical reasoning, moral philosophy, justice, responsibility, human rights, professional ethics, and contemporary ethical issues.

TDM 205 Introduction to Travel and Tourism

ECTS Credits: 6 | Contact Hours per Week: 3-0-0

Students explore the global tourism industry, including tourism systems, travel markets, destination development, sustainability, industry trends, and visitor experiences.
